

WFCU donates \$25,000 to sponsor field house at recreational complex

AMHERSTBURG — Windsor Family Credit Union (WFCU) has officially announced a donation of \$25,000 to support the United Communities Credit Union Complex.

The money will be used specifically to sponsor naming rights for the outdoor field house. The field house is located adjacent to the Miracle League baseball diamond for persons with special needs, Ontario's first community artificial turf baseball diamond and the soccer/CFL football field. The field house is comprised of a concession, patio seating, accessible washrooms, and storage for community groups along

with four change rooms for local and visiting teams.

Susan Stockwell-Andrews, vice president of external affairs and corporate secretary with WFCU, said the complex is an "absolutely amazing project" that the credit union is happy to be part of.

"It's a top-notch facility. We couldn't be happier to be part of it. To be a part of such a first-class community facility that will provide enjoyment for so many people, including those with special needs, is an honor," said Stockwell-Andrews.

"The mayor and council are to be congratulated on their efforts to make this project a reality. WFCU takes great pride in our community partnerships and we look forward to what the future will bring."

Mayor Wayne Hurst said the town "couldn't be happier" about WFCU's donation to sponsor the field house.

"This is an extremely generous donation," said Hurst.

"WFCU's gift to the Amherstburg Community Foundation in support of our new regional sport and recreational facility is deeply appreciated, and demonstrates their commitment to our community."

Debi Croucher, head of the Amherstburg Community Foundation, said WFCU has a long history of supporting the community.

"This is an extremely generous donation and we are deeply grateful for their support of Amherstburg's newest landmark," said Croucher.

The Town of Amherstburg received two-thirds of the funding for the construction of the \$23.6-million recreation complex from the governments of Canada and Ontario under the Build Canada Funding program. The town has embarked on a \$2-million fundraising campaign to offset its contribution to the project. To date, the fundraising campaign has raised in excess of \$1.5 million from corporate and personal donations.
